

NIGHTMARE ON ELM ST., PART III:

DREAM WARRIORS - Surprisingly good sequel brings back most of the original cast, as well as writer Wes Craven. A group of psychicly-gifted teenagers enter the dream-world of evil Freddy Krueger and confront him on his own turf. The most imaginitive of the three, with good special effects.

THE KINDRED - Low-budget monster movie about a young man whose genetic-scientist mom crossed his genes with others of unknown origin to create a new form of life. As bad as it sounds, with a few decent make-up effects. What are Rod Steiger and Kim Hunter doing in this mess?

HUNK - The Devil is at it again; this time turning a nerdy guy into the perfect man. The story, acting and special effects are all real poor. This was James Coco's last picture, and a sad end to a great performer's career. HUNK should have been retitled JUNK. O

ANGEL HEART - The Devil (Robert De Niro) hires a private detective (Mickey Rourke) to find a mysterious missing person. The Devil should have hired him to find the story in this slow moving film. Originally rated X, but cut down to an R, ANGEL HEART should have been rated B for boring. O
