We just mailed our 25,000-piece SF Book Club member mailing as well as Progress Report 4, are in the throes of finishing up the Program Book, and I'm working on the next issue of MAW (to be mailed in early to mid August).

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE start working on copy for the Pocket Program. Margaret Grady will be in touch with everyone (if she hasn't already by the time you read this) about copy submission deadlines. It would be very helpful if you brought your copy with you to the August 2, 1987 meeting.

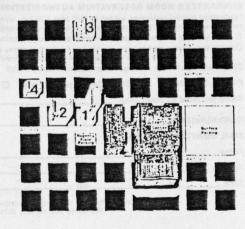

- 1) Memberships for all Committee members are complimentary. If you are in doubt whether an unfilled position is considered Committee, ask your superior. Committee members are noted as CAPS IN BOLD TYPE or CAPS, BUT NOT IN BOLD TYPE in the Committee and Volunteer list elsewhere in this STICKY ISSUES.
- 2) Volunteers (ie non-Committee) are asked to purchase memberships, though we hope to refund your membership (and possibly also reimburse a portion of your other convention expenses) if funds remain after the convention. All Committee and volunteers will have access to the Staff Lounge or Pro and Committee Lounge during the convention. We are also working on visits to the Gofer Hole by Pros during the convention as a bonus for volunteers. We also hope to provide special volunteer t-shirts to all volunteers.
- 3) If you want reimbursement for an expense, make sure it's authorized and in the scope of your job area. If in doubt, check with Bruce Farr. Be sure to get a receipt. Contact Bob Alongi, Treasury Assistant, for reimbursement.
- 4) Those listed as "Unassigned Volunteers" will be assigned to work for "Volunteers" department and assigned to help as needed at the con. While we need a lot of people to be available in this capacity, if you prefer being assigned to a particular department, let us know. Either contact the person in charge of the department or contact Ken Lemons of Volunteers. Also, let us know your prior convention volunteer experience.
- 5) COMMITTEE MEMBERS! If you need additional Staff for your area, take a look at the Unassigned Volunteers list. Make use of these people soon, or lose them to someone else. Let Ken Lemons (602-921-0653) know your needs and be certain to confer with the volunteer as well. Also, this Committee and Staff listing is issued to update you on people added to your department's Staff. We don't always remember to consult with you first, so look over the list as it now stands. If there's someone now listed you don't know or might not want as part of your staff, please let Ken Lemons know.
- 6) We're doing a couple of extras for all our volunteers. The first is that we're going to be giving CactusCon t-shirts to everyone who puts in time at the convention...they'll be given out on Saturday. Next, we'll be comping everyone who puts in 20 hours or more of work at CactusCon into CopperCon 7. CuCon 7 takes place two weeks after the NASFiC...everyone who put in sufficient hours (as determined by your department's records) will just need to show their NASFiC volunteer badge to get a CuCon 7 membership badge.

PEARL DIVERS WANTED, INQUIRE WITHIN

Included in this issue is a list of all committee positions and all volunteers. Many of you have already been placed in areas for the convention, but we still have many unassigned volunteers. All unassigned volunteers will soon be assigned to departments or to Volunteers department itself based on the need of those departments.

Please look to see where you are on the list. If you have volunteered for a specific area and you are listed as unassigned, please contact your department head right away. If you are unassigned and would like to work in a certain area, please contact Ken Lemons (see address/phone list enclosed) with your preference of areas or else complete and send in the enclosed form.

The official name of this convention is CactusCon, The 1987 North American Science Fiction Convention. Checks etc. can be made out to 1987 NASFiC or CactusCon.

Our best guess of actual attending membership is presently 3,500. Our breakeven point, including one-day memberships and being able to reimburse Bid Committee members' bid expenses and volunteers their memberships, is approximately 2,800.

We have almost 1300 hotel rooms available for the convention. The hotel room rates range from just over \$42.00 at one hotel and up to just over \$60.00 with \$58.00 being the average room rate. We have rooms blocked at the San Carlos, Adams Hilton (formerly Adams or Phoenix Hilton), Hyatt Regency, and Heritage (formerly Downtown Ramada) Hotels. We also have all of hotel function space reserved and the Hyatt is the Headquarters and Party Hotel. The Visitors Bureau will handle room reservations, which will be made from forms included in Progress Report 4. Do not count on the convention reserving space for you unless the Hotel Liaison, Sam Stubbs, has indicated that we will. If we remember to, there will also be a hotel reservation form included in with this STICKY ISSUES. It is part of the Special Mailing form we are planning on including with this STICKY ISSUES.

The official convention dates are from September 3-7, 1987 (Thursday through Monday over Labor Day Weekend). The first convention activities will be Art Show setup at the Civic Plaza on Tuesday, September 1. Activities begin on Wednesday, September 2, 1987 with setup and Pre-Registration, video, and Con Suite. Dealers' Room and Art Show open at noon on Thursday, September 3, 1987. Last Art Auction is on Monday, September 7 as well as the final day of the Dealers' Room.

CactusCon is sponsored by the Central Arizona Speculative Fiction Society, an IRS-recognised 501(c)3 non-profit corporation.

VOLUNTEERS

Ken Lemons and Volunteers is having great success in filling positions. We have over 340 people who have stated that they would like to work the convention. If you are going to be needing people, get your requests in to Ken as soon as possible. (Like now, folks.) The basic plans are that we will need 400 of us to work the entire convention (excluding an extra 50 to fill in for no-shows, etc.) and that is our goal. But if we don't get requests from departments heads for personnel, we may decide that all of your department's staffing has been taken care of and so we won't be looking for more for you. Remember that you don't need to tell us exactly how many people you will need and when. That can wait until later. But we do need to know roughly how many people you wil need. Just figure out how much work needs to be done for each day and work it out from there. So please, department heads, get that information in to Ken NOW.

MOVING?

We receive address changes from the U.S. Post Office with each issue of STICKY ISSUES. In fact, about 14 with the last issue

If you're moving, please send us your new address. Getting an address correction costs us \$.22 each time and results in your not getting that issue of STICKY ISSUES. This gets more important as CactusCon approaches, as you may miss critical info about your at-con job.

So, please send us your new address and phone number if you are moving! Thank you.

NOTES FROM THE EDITOR

This is the end of July and we are less than two months away from the start of the convention. There are many things that need to be finished now. You know what I mean. We also need to start getting in shape for the convention. Remember that a little work now can save you pain later.

Everybody should be doing some exercising now to get in shape for the first week of September. If you aren't doing anything now, even a walk after supper will help. Just something to get the blood pumping and the limbs stronger. If this doesn't sound like fun, try a little sex...great for the heart.

Also, don't buy a new pair of shoes just before the convention. Nothing is worse than sore feet because of a new pair of shoes. Get the shoes early and give yourself a chance to break them in properly. Your feet will thank you later.

It may seem that all of this is real simple and some of you may be sitting out there asking why I am ghoing through all of this. The reason is that I have seen several times where people will carry on with their lives just like normal. By Sunday afternoon we all feel like we have done everything at the convention and it's time to go home and sleep. Well, at the small, local conventions this is alright because come Sunday afternoon the convention is almost finished and we expect to be exhausted. If we follow through with this action at the NASFIC, we will be dead around Friday evening with three days to go. So please get yourselves ready for the convention.

Another item to be thinking about now is your diet. The correct foods can help you make it through the convention and you should be eating them now to build up your reserves. Be sure to eat the correct foods so that you are ready to go out there and filk to the world. If you're not taking vitamins now, it is a good time to start. Let's take care of our bodies now so that we can handle the stress later.

Now that we have gotten our bodies ready for the long weekend, we should also take the time to get our minds ready. Be prepared to work long hours and get little sleep. After all, that is what conventions are all about. All of those little problems you are having now about your departments...get them worked out in advance so that you are relaxed when you go into the con. Stress can cause you more problems than you realize. At our last convention, we had a volunteer taken to the hospital for a mild heart attack brought on by stress. Let's not repeat that again. I almost had one trying to find out how she was.

Basically, what I am trying to say is to take care of yourselves and get ready for the convention. There are not that many of us who have worked large conventions before and we cannot go into them with the same attitude we would if this were one of our small, local conventions. CactusCon will run for five full days rather than the usual two and one-half days a local con is open for. If we set up the same way, we will never make it through the weekend. So please get yourself ready by whatever means are necessary so that you can enjoy the convention and make it memorable for the attendees. You know the attendees...they're the reason why we do all these crazy things in preparation for the convention.

Another item to keep in mind is the heat that we will have here in Arizona during the end of August and the beginning of September. The daytime temperature can get as high as 105 degrees, which is cooler than we are currently having, but the humidity will be much higher. Sometimes it gets as high as 55 or 60 percent. With the humidity that high, the ambient temperature can be upwards of 150 degrees. Now this should not scare you away. Rather, remember that you will not be able to cool your

body as easily as you would with a lower humidity. As we all know, the body cools itself by sweat evaporating from the skin and when the humidity is high, the evaporation is slower. Be sure to drink lots of water during your stay at the convention. People, most of them locals, are taken to the hospital every summer because of heat stroke because they don't think about the weather. If you feel yourself getting weak get inside, drink water and lie down. The early symptoms of this are weakness, headaches and so on. Be sure to eat some salt during the day also as when you sweat you lose salt quickly.

Also, when you drink alcohol you dehydrate even faster, so keep the beer consumption low during the day. The nighttime temperatures will drop down to the mid 80's, and this will feel much cooler. But remember that the humidity will still be high. The humidity will be higher in the morning because the cool night air will condense the moisture, but much of that burns off by ten or so in the morning. So remember to get in shape for the weekend and be careful while you are down here.

Finally, note that it shouldn't be necessary to walk outside very often. Daytime activities are almost entirely at the Civic Plaza. Try to arrange your schedule so that walking between the hotels and the Plaza is kept at a minimum...the more you have to walk outside, the greater the risk.

COSTUME PROGRAMMING

Costume programming at a convention this large is a task, but one that our staff is more than equal to. Pati Cook has asked me to pass on the word to her staff.

There will be a meeting of all people involved in the masquerade and in costume programming over at Pati's house. The meeting will take place Aug. 16 at 2:30 pm. All members of her staff are urged to attend because this will be the last big meeting before the convention.

If you need directions to her house, you can call the phone number listed in the address list located at the end of this mailing. She does ask that if you call you do it after 4:00 pm as then you can talk directly to her. If you happen to call at other times and Pati is not at home, please call again as the phone monster may or may not get the message to his wife.

PROGRAM BOOKLET/POCKET PROGRAM

We need schedule information and department writeups from all departments for the Program Booklet ASAP. The first pickup for information will be at the August 2 Meeting at the Hyatt...please turn in as much as possible as soon as possible. Margaret Grady is in charge of gathering material for the Booklet, after which it will be turned over to Terry Gish for grunging into 'puter.

CONVENTION POSITION ASSIGNMENTS

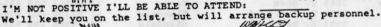

ARRIVING AT CACTUSCON

Please be sure to check with your Department Head as to when you're able to/need to show up at the convention. We'll be having registration for volunteers out of the Volunteer Lounge on the Third Floor of the Hyatt as of Tuesday afternoon. The only other thing going on Tuesday will be setup for the Art Show.

Wednesday will be the busiest day for setup. That day we'll be setting up for everywhere else at the Civic Plaza (remember that the Plaza is the site of the Art Show, Dealers' Room, Exhibit Hall, daytime Main Program, video, and films). Regular membership registration starts at 5 pm at the Hyatt's Regency Ballroom. After that starts up, volunteer registration will also be out of the Regency Ballroom. Registration after hours on Wednesday and thereafter will be at the convention office in the Hyatt (2nd floor) and daytime registration for Thursday and thereafter will be in the North Lobby of the Civic Plaza.

We will need lots of help on Wednesday for the setup activities, as well as for Thursday morning and early afternoon with the beginning of the Program. Thursday afternoon is also when the Dealers' Room and Art Show open to members.

Finally, Monday afternoon and evening will be teardown for the convention. By 6 pm on Monday, the only thing happening will be the Hospitality Suite. Monday teardown is always the toughest thing we face since by then no one feels like moving, let alone tearing things apart (that is, CAREFULLY tearing things apart). We'll greatly appreciate all the help we can get for Monday.

Again, be sure to check with your department as to when you need to or can be there. We appreciate all the help you and everyone else is giving us. We want to be able to integrate your efforts the best we can into those of everyone else working the con.

THE STAFF LOUNGE/ THE GOPHER HOLE

The Staff Lounge will be a separate room from the gopher hole. This is because the Staff Lounge will also be the Pro Lounge during the day. Both will be a good place for you to visit while you are visiting our fair convention. Hilde Hildebrand is in overall charge of the areas with Tom and Tarsie Franklin in charge of the Gopher Hole. Either one of these places are a must see for you if you want to keep your department head happy during the convention.

Remember earlier I was telling you to be sure to eat some good food during the convention...these are the places to go. Along with the usual fruit and veggies, there will be more wholesome items like sandwich makings and some hot soup. I know all of the itmes that are going to be available and, believe me, they all have the Eric Hanson Seal of Approval attached. Not only will the food be good for you, it will look and taste good. Hilde has been in fandom for several years and has seen the results of improperly fed workers.

Hilde takes great pride in knowing that her food has made the difference between success and failure in keeping the volunteers happy. LOGISTICS
