

#### **Greetings From The Chair**

Confirmed guests at CopperCon X are:

Guests of Honor: Keith Laumer — Author of the Layfayette O'Leary books, the James Retief (galactic diplomat) series, and many individual novels of note (Bolo, Plague of Demons, Worlds of Imperium, etc.). Keith is probably best known for his use of humor/satire in his books.

Guest of Honor: David Gerrold — Author of the War Against The Chtorr series, Yesterday's Children, When Harlie Was One, and many other novels. David is also the author of multiple Star Trek, Logan's Run, and Land Of The Lost episodes and was story editor for Land Of The Lost and Buck Rogers.

Fan GOH: Wilson "Bob" Tucker — Wilson has been active in fandom since the 30's. He has published several fanzines and began writing science-fiction and mysteries in the 40's. The most common theme in his science-fiction is time travel. He also wrote one of the finest novels of the cold-war era, The Long, Loud Silence.

Programming will include Videos, Japanimation, Gaming, Dances, Art Show, Dealers Room, Filking, original one-of-a-kind panels, and more. Autograph sessions will be scheduled for convention guests in the dealers room.

A word about price. We are working to avoid raising prices — your support is essential to holding our costs down. CASFS is a non-profit organization. All the people working on the convention are volunteers — this means no pay. Volunteers who work 12 hours receive a complimentary membership to next year's CopperCon. We are hoping to attract about 200 more members than we had at CopperCon 9. We are expanding our advertising campaign to do this. We will also be checking to be sure everyone has a badge. Badges are required for all convention activities.

This year's committee is very experienced, talented, and imaginative. We are all looking forward to the con and if the budget permits we will have the first annual Fruce Barr Memorial Jello Wrestling Free-For-All (I know he's still alive but if he was dead he wouldn't be much of a participant.)

#### **Programming**

Programming is in the planning stage at this time. In addition to time-honored traditions such as meeting the pros, there will be some more unusual events and gaming panels. We are planning for three tracks of programming that will appeal to your literacy, artistic, and fun sides.

In addition there will be a Clarion-type writers workshop requiring pre-con submissions and limited to the first six people who submit manuscripts (see next page).



#### Writers Workshop — Pre-Con Submissions Required

Kit Townsend, a Clarion West graduate, has agreed to organize and run a writers' workshop for CopperCon. Participation is limited to the first six acceptable manuscripts received from people with paid memberships. Four alternates will also be selected on a first-come basis. If you wish to be a part of this group, send your neatly typed, double spaced, *legible* story, with one inch margins (basic manuscript form, folks) of not more than 40 pages to Kit in care of M. F. McKersie, P.O. Box 24156, Tempe, AZ 85285-4156. Be sure to include *two* self-addressed, stamped envelopes. One SASE will need extra postage. This envelope will be used to mail each participant instructions of what to do pre-con and copies of the other people's writing. Please be sure to include your phone number so you can be reached in case of questions or problems. Those manuscripts that arrive once all the slots have been filled will be returned to the writers as soon as possible.

#### Registration!

Registration rules will be pretty much the same this year as in the past. First and foremost is *keep your badge with you at all times* and *guard it carefully!* Your badge is your key to the convention activities and if lost, stolen, or simply left at home, will cost you money to replace. How much, you ask? The answer is — whatever membership rates are at the time you try to replace the badge.

As to rates, that is one of the two things that will be different this year. In the past we have had full memberships and one-day memberships for each day the convention was officially open. This year the membership prices will be more on a sliding scale depending on when you buy them. First, of course, there will be a full membership. If purchased prior to August 15th, the price is \$20.00. If purchased at the door, the price is \$25.00. Once the convention has started registration, we will have a one-day membership price for Fridayonly attendees of \$12.00. People purchasing memberships on Saturday prior to 4:45pm for the rest of the convention will pay \$20.00. At 5:00pm, the rate for a membership to the rest of the convention will be \$15.00. If anyone would like to buy a membership on Sunday, the rate will be \$10.00. If you have any questions on this rate structure, please contact me through the convention post office box. I will be glad to hear any feedback. These rates will be published again in future PR's and posted in the registration office at the convention. We don't want anyone to be surprised at the new rate structure.

Now as for the second thing that will be different this year. Due to requests that registration remain open longer, we are going to try to comply this year. Registration hours will be as follows:
