Ostensibly a look at an average Beatle day, filled as it is with such average things as packed press conferences, television appearances and hundreds of moaning female fans, the film managed to deflate TV, press agents, the police, all hucksters and Her Majesty's Government during the proceedings, plus get in about 15 classic Beatle songs. Its zingy one liners, its almost improvised "new cinema" direction by Richard Lester, an excellent supporting cast of master English satirists and best of all, the blissful performances of the shaggy quartet themselves, makes this one of the finest English exports ever.

Directed by John Halas and Joy Batchelor. A unique, full-length animated feature adapted from George Orwell's political satire. Tired of their cruel master's oppression, farm animals stage a revolt, setting up a new society on the farm which soon turns into a dictatorship controlled by the pigs whose slogan is 'All animals are equal, but some animals are more equal than others.' 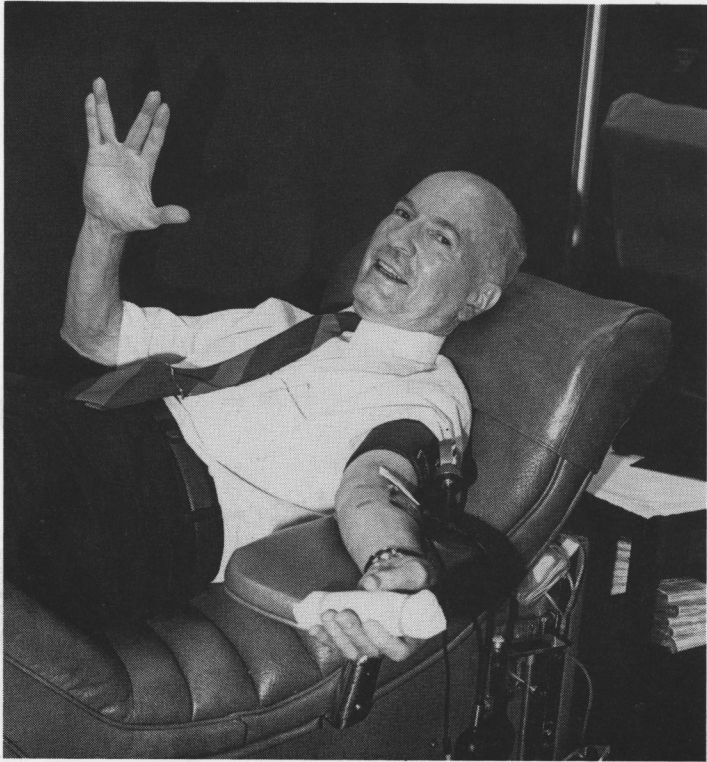

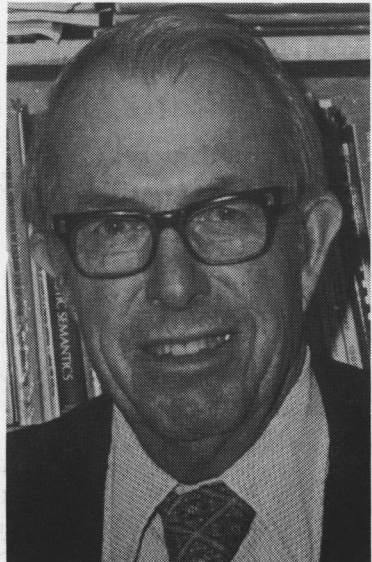
WALTER KOENIG



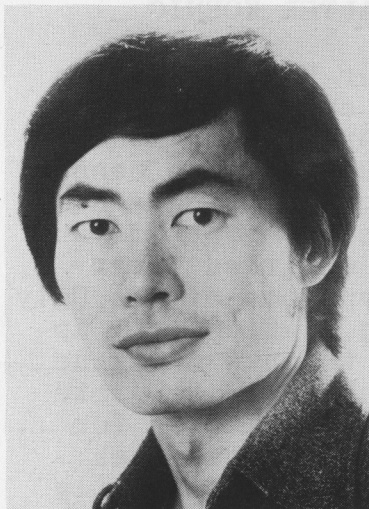

GRACE LEE WHITNEY

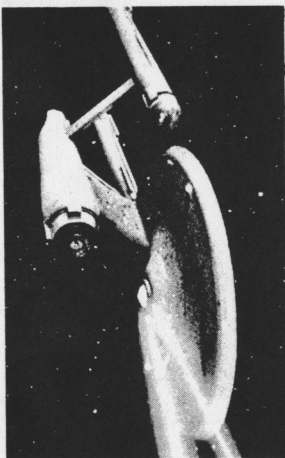
