


As far as panels go, you'll have an interesting variety to choose from — there's a little bit here for everyone!

Author Guest of Honor

Author of about 60 sf/f novels

A best-selling author of over sixty novels, encompassing two science fiction series and four fantasy series, as well as several other novels in the science fiction genre. Best known for *The Saga of Recluce* series, *The*



Corean Chronicles, and The Imager Portfolio.

Mr. Modesitt has been a delivery boy; a lifeguard; an unpaid radio disc jockey; a U.S. Navy pilot; a market research analyst; a real estate agent; a director of research for a political campaign; legislative assistant and staff director for a U.S. Congressman; Director of Legislation and Congressional Relations for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency; a consultant on environmental, regulatory, and communications issues; and a college lecturer and writer in residence.

In addition to his novels, Mr. Modesitt has published technical studies and articles, columns, poetry, and a number of science fiction stories. His first story was published in 1973. He lives in Cedar City, Utah.

Steve Leialoha

Artist Guest of Honor

Eisner Award-winning Inker

His professional career began in 1975 with the early independent comic book *Star*Reach*, drawing the five-page story "Wooden Ships on the Water," adapted by writer Mike Friedrich from the song by



Crosby, Stills, and Kantner, in issue #3 (Sept. 1975). He continued to contribute to *Star*Reach* and the same publisher's *Quack* for four years.


Leialoha freelanced as a regular contributor to Marvel from 1976 to 1988, working on such series as Warlock, Star Wars, Spider-Woman, the Spider-Man title Marvel Team-Up, the Firestar limited series, New Mutants, and

Howard the Duck. In the 1990s, Leialoha began working at DC on Batman and other characters; at Harris Comics on Vampirella; and at Claypool Comics on Soulsearchers and Company. The following decade, he became the regular inker on most of the issues (through 2010) of the DC/Vertigo series Fables, penciled by Mark Buckingham, for which they won the Eisner Award for "Best Penciller/Inker Team" in 2007. He lives in San Francisco with his partner, comics artist Trina Robbins. Writer Larry Hama named G.I. Joe character Edward Leialoha (code name 'Torpedo') after Steve.

Mike Grell

Media Guest of Honor

Comic book writer & artist, known mostly for *Green Lan*tern/Green Arrow, Warlord, and Jon Sable Freelance





creation, *The Warlord*. The character first appeared in *1st Issue Special* #8 (Nov 1975) and was soon given his own ongoing title (*The Warlord* #1, Jan/Feb 1976).

At DC, Grell also worked on characters such as Aquaman, Batman, and the Phantom Stranger, and with writer Dennis O'Neil on the re-launch of the *Green Lantern/Green Arrow* series in 1976.

Through the 1980s Grell developed creator-owned titles such *Jon Sable Freelance* and *Starslayer. Jon Sable Freelance* was published by the now-defunct First Comics. *Starslayer*, a space-born science fiction series, started at Pacific Comics, but shifted to First.

In 1987, Mike Grell wrote and drew the 3-issue prestige format limited series *Green Arrow: The Longbow Hunters.* He redesigned the character's costume, away from the costume Neal Adams had designed in 1969, and recast Green Arrow as an "urban hunter" going up against non-super-powered, real world villains such as serial killers, terrorists, street gangs, American mobsters and Japanese Yakuza. He did away with Green Arrow's arsenal of "trick arrows" and instead rearmed him with penetrating broadheads with which he actually killed his opponents.

The popularity of *Longbow Hunters* led to an assignment writing – and occasionally drawing – an ongoing *Green Arrow* series for 80 issues from 1988 to 1994. During this run, Grell avoided references to the fantastical elements of the DC Universe. Notably, believing "Green Arrow" was "a stupid name," in no Mike Grell Green Arrow story (with the exception of *Longbow Hunters* #1) is the character ever referred to as Green Arrow anywhere other than on the cover.

Other work includes a new ongoing series of *Warlord* launched to coincide with the 35th anniversary. His last collaboration with DC to date has been the Green Lantern story for the *DC Retroactive* series, in 2011.

In 2012, Grell provided the cover art for the preview comic produced by DC Comics for San Diego Comic-Con to promote the TV series *Arrow*.

Trina Robbins

Historian Guest of Honor

Award-winning herstorian and writer

Trina has been writing graphic novels, comics and books for over thirty years, ever since she produced the first all-woman comic book, *It Ain't Me, Babe*, in 1970. She is the creator of *Wimmen's Comix*. Her subjects



have ranged from Wonder Woman and the Powerpuff Girls to her own teenage superheroine, GoGirl!, and from women cartoonists and superheroines to women who kill. She is considered the expert on the subject of early 20th century women cartoonists, and is responsible for rediscovering many brilliant but previously-forgotten women, including Golden Age Fiction House cartoonist Lily Renee, and the great Nell Brinkley. Among her recent books: *The Brinkley Girls: the Best of Nell Brinkley's Cartoons from 1913-1940* (Fantagraphics, 2009), and *Tarpe Mills and Miss Fury* (IDW, 2011). Her final and definitive history of women cartoonists *Pretty in Ink*, (Fantagraphics) will see publication in August, 2013. A collection of the Golden Age comics of Lily Renee will be published later this year.

Liz Safian Berube

Local Artist Guest of Honor

Elizabeth "Liz" Berube (born Elizabeth Ann Safian) is a comic book artist and colorist, best known for her work at DC Comics, especially on romance titles.



Jennifer Roberson

Local Author Guest of Honor

Best known for her *Cheysuli* and *Sword-Dancer* series

Since 1984, Jennifer Roberson has published 24 solo novels, with her primary genre, fantasy, divided among three different universes.



April 2006 saw the debut of

Karavans, the first novel in a new series, followed by the release of *Deepwood* in July 2007. Two additional volumes are under contract. Roberson has also published the 6-volume *Sword-Dancer* saga, and eight novels in the *Chonicles of the Cheysuli*; three new Cheysuli novels are planned. In 1996 she collaborated with fantasy authors Melanie Rawn and Kate Elliott on *The Golden Key*. Roberson has also edited several fantasy anthologies. Her novels and anthologies have been translated and published in Germany, France, Japan, China, Sweden, Poland, Hungary, Russia, Italy, Israel, and the UK.

Following the maxim "write what you love," Jennifer has published three mainstream historical novels, including *Lady of the Forest* and its sequel, *Lady of Sherwood*, reinterpreting the Robin Hood legend with emphasis on Marian's role. The third is a Scottish historical, titled *Lady of the Glen*, based on the documented story of the Massacre of Glencoe, which occured in the Highlands in the 17th century when the Campbells attempted to wipe out the MacDonalds.

Earlier credits include a western, a historical romance, a romantic suspense, and a novel set in television's *Highlander* universe of the 1990s. Though primarily a novelist, Roberson has also published approximately 30 short stories in various anthologies and magazines.

Toni Darling

Cosplay Guest of Honor

Best-known for her cross-play of Thor

Hailing from the Empire State, Toni Darling busted onto the scene at the Zombie Bikini Contest in downtown Mesa, AZ in January of 2012. She dressed up as a cowgirl zombie



and with that paved a path of her own in the local geek community.

From Amazing Arizona Con to WonderCon, VulCon, Phoenix ComiCon (where she co-emceed the masquerade contest), and of course to SDCC. You have most likely caught a glimpse of this striking beauty and her bubbly personality reporting for a local video blog, Geekssociated Press. She has held her own against the likes of Robert Kirkman and Tom Sizemore and contributing to Brian Augustyn's "The Comic Book Insider" show every week at Gotham City Comics.

Additionally, she promotes Kipsworld, Knightingail Comics, and Paolo Parente's *Dust* through cosplay,

most recently doing a cross-play of Thor and Lady Death. Along with her beauty, fun personality, and intelligence, her ambition will most certainly propel her to the forefront of the geek community.

Randall Whitlock

Fan Guest of Honor

Former President of CASFS and pun-ishing costumer


Randall Whitlock has been an active SF/medieval/renaissance costumer since the early 80's, with a certain reputation for visual pun costumes, such as



"Dances with Werewolves," "Bjorn of Borg," and "The Dookus of Hazzard." Randall wrote the "Costume Closet" column in *ConNotations* for many years, edits the Southwest Costumers Guild newsletter *Cactus Needles*, and drafts the Randwulf's line of sewing patterns. Randall has directed the Masquerades at the first North American Discworld Convention, LepreCon, and several CopperCons. 

CGC Signature Series

Roberson.

At CopperCon, collectors can have their comic books, comic magazines, photographs and magazines signed by their favorite creators in the presence of a CGC

representative. These comics can then be authenticated, graded and certified by CGC under the prestigious CGC Signature Series label!

The CGC Signature Series label (yellow) is applied to comic books that have been signed by someone of significance to the comic, under the direct observation of a CGC representative. The signatures are then authenticated by CGC with the labels indicating who signed the book, the date it was signed, and in some cases the location of where it was signed.

After the comic book or comic magazine is signed in the presence of a CGC employee or CGC authorized witness, the book is immediately submitted to CGC for grading and encapsulation in CGC's patented, tamper-evident holder, to become a treasured part of your collection.

Pop Culture Paradise, the valley's only Authorized CGC Signature Series Facilitator, will be available here at CopperCon to provide this service. Any comic submitted through this process will be graded, receive the yellow label, and then be shipped back to Pop Culture Paradise for you to be able to pick up when it comes in.

Comics already signed are not eligible for submission. Previously signed comics not verified by CGC will just get a green label marked with Name Written on Cover.

Almost every comic is eligible for this service. The exceptions are Treasury-Sized Comics – CGC does not have a holder for this comic and will not accept them; previously signed comics without CGC Signature Series label; and CGC Signature Series comics in which the seal is broken already and it was not done by CGC or a CGC SS facilitator at-con just before signing.

Original artwork done at-con by the artist or just before con and brought by the artist is eligible, you just need to get the witness from Pop Culture before you take it away from the artist. Yes, it will get the wording "Sign and Sketch" by this person on this date.

The recommended procedure, if you want to get this done: Stop over by Pop Culture Paradise's booth before you get anything signed or any artwork created. Pop Culture will make sure everything is explained clearly to you so the process goes smoothly. They will make sure you get all the information you need so you will know what to do. "Knowing is half the battle!"

To place an advance bid you will need to stop by the Volunteer table, where the items will be on display. Write your name and number on the form for the item you are interested in, along with your highest bid.


Please be available for us to call you during the auction in case you win or are outbid. We can accept PayPal or cash for payment.





Operations & Policies

THE OPERATIONS TEAM IS HERE TO HELP YOU ENJOY YOUR COPPERCON REVOLUTION EXPERIENCE! They will act as a buffer between convention members and the hotel staff and the public. Please keep in mind that Arizona does have laws concerning alcohol, illegal substances, and public nudity. Please use common sense and think before you do something. If an action will get you into trouble in the outside world, it will probably get you into trouble at CopperCon.

General Operations Policies


1) If you are concerned with your safety or the safety of another please contact the Operations Office, an Operations Team member (usually wearing a RED badge), or any CopperCon Staff member. They are here to help, and to ensure that you have an enjoyable convention experience. 2) Please feel free to contact Operations at any time if you have questions about the convention or need any assistance. 3) Have fun and be courteous of your fellow CopperCon attendees.

Badge Policy

1) Your badge shows that you are a member of convention. Convention attendees are required to have their badge displayed so that it is visible and readable at all times. 2) A badge is required to access all convention programming and function space. Badges may not be shared with, or loaned to anyone. 3) Acceptance of the badge releases the convention from all liability in the event of accident, damage, or theft while on convention premises. 4) The badge remains the property of the convention until the close of the convention and must be surrendered on demand. 5) CopperCon reserves the right to refuse admission to or to eject any person whose conduct is deemed in the sole discretion of convention personnel to be unsafe or disorderly.

Weapons Policy

1) ALL weapon-like props MUST BE TAKEN TO THE OPERA-TIONS OFFICE for review and peace bonding. CopperCon Operations reserves the right to refuse permission to carry any prop. 2) All owners of weapon-like props will read and sign a copy of the CopperCon Weapons Policy, which will be kept on file in the Operations Office for the duration of the convention 3) Absolutely NO horse-play with weapon-like props will be tolerated. 4) No real or realistic firearms are allowed at the convention at any time for any reason. Violation of this policy can result in revocation of membership and removal from the convention and convention site.



5) Bladed weapons such as swords and knives are permitted provided they are kept in a hard sheath and peace-bonded. 6) All weapon-like props will be carried or worn in such a manner that other individuals in the convention venue are not at risk of being hit or touched by the prop. 7) Unsheathed or non-peace-bonded bladed weapons are not permitted at any time. Any person carrying a blade in an unsafe manner, or any non-peace-bonded or unsheathed blade, will be asked to store the item in their room or vehicle for the remainder of the convention. Further offenses may result in the item being confiscated until the end of the convention, or other action by the Operations Team.

Room Party Policy

1) Private individuals and groups are welcome to hold parties near, around, and/or during CopperCon. (These are parties held in privately rented hotel rooms). CopperCon has no direct control over these parties and thus is not responsible for any activity at them.
2) Parties must be registered with the Operations Team no later than 2:00 pm on the day they are held. If you plan to hold a party, inform the hotel that you need to be in the "Party Area" when making your reservations. The party room must be located within the designated area in order to be registered. Contacting the convention's Hotel Liaison as well is strongly suggested, since they can assure you are in compliance.

3) The Coordinator of a Registered Party must purchase a convention membership. Others staffing or attending a party are encouraged, but not required, to purchase their own memberships. Party Coordinators are allowed to book room(s) or suite(s) for a party at the convention rate that will be located in the party area. Discounted convention hotel rates will be provided, and the convention will act as a buffer between the party and hotel security when possible.

4) Any unregistered parties can be subject to receiving non-convention hotel rates, and will deal directly with hotel security or Police if problems occur.

Violations

Any convention attendee violating any weapons or Operations Policies and Procedures will be referred to Operations Team for appropriate action, which may include, but is not limited to the following: * Verbal warnings * Badge punching to track verbal warnings * Confiscation or removal of unsuitable weapons / props * Removal from function space, event, or convention site * Revocation of membership * In extreme situations, Local Police authorities may be notified at the Operations Team's discretion.
