

# C.C.BECK





The original (aptain Marvel,
Fawcett's red-clad knight of
democracy, was, at the peak of
his 13 year career the biggest
selling comic book character of
all time.

Two men, Bill Parker and Co.C. Beck were directly responsible for the creation of Captain Marvel. Later others like Otto Binder,

Will Lieberson, Ed Herron and Wendell Crowly added their own immaginative touches to the masterpieces.

It is Beck, however who is best remembered and most associated with the strip. From the first copy of Whiz #1 (2) in 1940, to Fawcett's comic demise in 1953, (.C. Beck remained at the helm of Captain Marvel's stable of artists. His simple but charming style set the book's art standard and contributed to the Captain's wide appeal to both young and old.






vespite his facility as a cartoonist Beck never actually had training in this area. On the other hand he did have a strong background in illustration and this is readily evident in his beautiful characterization and keen understanding of anatomy. Then in 1953 Fawcett closed down its comic line, Beck spent a brief histus as a bar owner before returning to a more natural habitat; commercial art. Except for a brief return to comics in 1967 he has been in that line ever since.


A man of many facets, (.C. Beck's talents are not limited to the cartoon panel. He is a writer, a craftsman and a musician of considerable ability.


It is with great pride that Phoenix(on-2 is able to present as guest of honor, (.C. Beck, one of the giants of the Golden Age of Comics.




