

Rules & Regulations

All patrons are required to abide by the following rules at all times:

- Represent Old Tucson (OT) and Wild Wild West Steampunk Convention II (WWWC2) in a professional and courteous manner.
- · No abusive or foul language.
- · No fighting.
- · No loitering.
- No consumption of illegal drugs.
- · No lewd or lascivious behavior.
- · No animals.
- The park opens at 10:00am and closes at 6:00pm every day. No re-entry into Old Tucson after 5:00 PM *. Re-entry into Old Tucson is only allowed with an approved wristband.
- · No touching of actors or sets.
- · No modification of any OT structure.
- No modification of any hotel structure.
- · No masks which impair vision.
- Weapons shall be inspected by authorized personnel for safety and peace tied.

Guests may be removed from the premises for violations of these rules, OT rules or Hotel rules without compensation or refund. Security personnel from WWWC2, OT and the Hotels have the authority to enforce all rules.

If you are going to one of the evening concert events, you are required to have a valid event ticket to get into the concert after official park hours have closed.

You are not required to have a WWWC2 pass (Maverick or Explorer) to attend the Friday or Saturday concert events.

*The only part of Old Tucson that will be open after hours is the **Grand Palace Saloon**, where the concerts are held.
